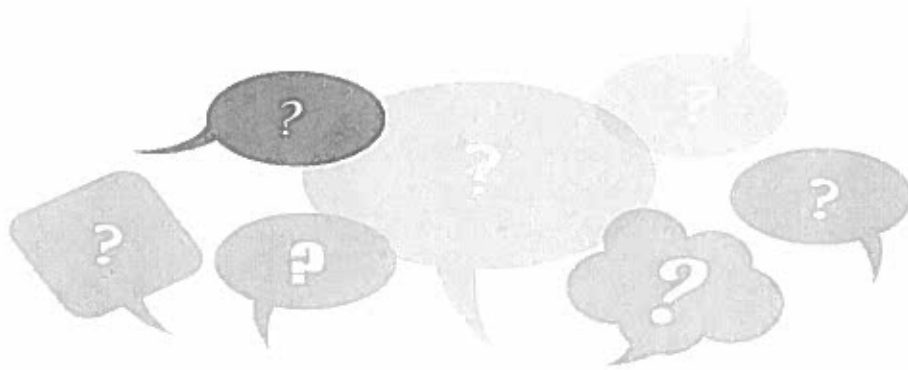

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS FOR 9TH GRADE

- 👤 DOES 9TH GRADE COUNT?
 - Yes! Credit accrual and GPA begin with high school classes taken in middle school.
- 👤 DO I HAVE A GPA FROM MIDDLE SCHOOL?
 - Only if you took high school courses in middle school (such as Algebra 1).
- 👤 HOW MANY CREDITS DOES IT TAKE TO BE A SOPHOMORE?
 - Six credits are required to be categorized as a 10th grade student.
- 👤 DO ELECTIVES COUNT?
 - Every class counts towards your graduation requirements and GPA.
- 👤 WILL MY 9TH GRADE GPA INFLUENCE WHICH CLASSES I WILL TAKE IN 10TH GRADE?
 - Yes. Your academic history is considered when enrolling in core and Career and Technical Education (CTE) classes.
- 👤 HOW MANY CREDITS ARE REQUIRED TO GRADUATE?
 - You are required to complete at least 24 credits.
- 👤 WHAT IS FOCUS?
 - FOCUS is an online tool available to students, parents, and school staff. It provides access to schedules, attendance, live grades, academic history, and includes a messenger that can be used to communicate directly with teachers. Instructions for creating a parent account can be found online on our school's website.
- 👤 HOW DO I CONTACT TEACHERS IF I HAVE QUESTIONS OR CONCERNS?
 - Teachers can be reached by e-mail, phone, and through FOCUS. E-mails and phone numbers are listed in the Staff Directory on our school's website.
- 👤 HOW DO I CONTACT MY SCHOOL COUNSELOR?
 - You can call or e-mail your counselor directly or speak with the Guidance Secretary to set up an appointment time. Walk-ins are welcome before school, during lunch, and after school.
- 👤 HOW CAN STUDENTS RECEIVE ADDITIONAL SUPPORT?
 - Teachers are often available after school and we offer a tutoring lab with transportation twice per week. Teachers can be contacted directly to set up conferences throughout the year. We also set aside two evenings per semester for conference nights. These are scheduled for November and February.
- 👤 HOW CAN I GET INFORMATION ON ATHLETICS?
 - You can see the Athletic Secretary, Ms. Betz, in the administration building or contact the coach of the sport you are interested in pursuing directly.

-  DO I HAVE TO COMPLETE AN ONLINE COURSE TO GRADUATE?
- You must complete an online course prior to graduation. You can speak with your counselor for additional information and suggestions.
-  WHAT STANDARDIZED TESTS DO STUDENTS HAVE TO TAKE IN HIGH SCHOOL?
- Students are required to take benchmark tests, FSA Reading and Writing tests, and EOC's attached to specific courses.
-  DO I HAVE TO PASS ANY EOC'S (END OF COURSE EXAMS) TO GRADUATE?
- You must pass the Algebra 1 EOC and you must take the Biology, Geometry, and U.S. History EOC's to be eligible for graduation. EOC's count for 30% of each semester grade for respective tests, so it is important that you do as well as possible on each one.
-  DO I HAVE TO TAKE A READING CLASS?
- Placement in these classes is determined by the English Language Arts Assessment for the previous school year. You must receive a passing score to be excused.
-  HOW DO I GET OUT OF A READING CLASS?
- You can be exempt from taking these classes the following school year by achieving a passing score on the English Language Arts assessment.
-  WHEN WILL I RECEIVE MY SCHEDULE?
- Schedules will be available for viewing in FOCUS the week before school starts. Physical copies will be handed out to students through first period on the first day.
-  CAN I CHANGE MY SCHEDULE?
- We recommend that you notify us of any changes in class preferences prior to the first day of school so that we can best accommodate you. Due to class size amendments and availability, you may not receive your first choices. We cannot make schedule changes beyond the first week of school.
-  DO 9TH GRADE STUDENTS HAVE HOMEWORK?
- Yes, you will have homework!
-  IS A STUDENT REQUIRED TO HAVE AN AGENDA?
- No, but you will receive one and we encourage you to use it.
-  IF I FAIL A CLASS, DO I HAVE TO MAKE IT UP?
- If you fail a required course for graduation, you must make it up. Courses can be retaken when a student receives a "D" or "F." Keep in mind that every course, including electives, impacts your GPA. You must have an overall GPA of 2.0 in order to graduate.
-  IS A "D" A PASSING GRADE?
- A "D" is considered a passing grade, however, students must maintain a "C" average (2.0 GPA) in order to be eligible for graduation.
-  WHY DO STUDENTS FAIL?
- Students are likely to fail when they do not attend classes, do not complete or turn in classwork or homework, and/or do not study for tests.
-  IS ATTENDANCE IMPORTANT?
- Attendance is extremely important. If you are not in class, you miss direct instruction as well as the opportunity to turn in assignments and take tests.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the diploma options?

Students must successfully complete one of the following diploma options:

- 24-credit standard diploma
- 18-credit Academically Challenging Curriculum to Enhance Learning (ACCEL)
- Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) curriculum
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma curriculum

What are the state assessment requirements?

Students **must pass** the following statewide assessments:

- Grade 10 English Language Arts (ELA) or a concordant score
- Algebra 1 end-of-course (EOC) or a comparative score

Refer to [Graduation Requirements for Florida's Statewide Assessments](#) for concordant and comparative scores.

Students enrolled in the following courses **must participate** in the EOC assessments, which constitute 30 percent of the final course grade:*

- Algebra 1
- Geometry
- Biology 1
- U.S. History

*Special note: Thirty percent not applicable if not enrolled in the course but passed the EOC (credit acceleration program [CAP]).

What is the CAP?

The CAP program allows a student to earn high school credit if the student passes an Advanced Placement (AP) examination, a College Level Examination Program (CLEP) or a statewide course assessment without enrollment in the course. The courses include the following subjects:

- Algebra 1
- Geometry
- Biology 1
- U.S. History

What is the distinction between the 18-credit ACCEL option and the 24-credit option?

- 3 elective credits instead of 8
- Physical Education is not required
- Online course is not required

All other graduation requirements for a 24-credit standard diploma must be met (per section 1003.4282(3)(a)-(e), Florida Statutes [F.S.]).

Scholar Diploma Designation

In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard high school diploma requirements, a student must meet all of the following requirements:

- Earn 1 credit in Algebra 2
- Pass the Geometry EOC
- Earn 1 credit in statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course
- Pass the Biology 1 EOC*
- Earn 1 credit in chemistry or physics
- Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to chemistry or physics
- Pass the U.S. History EOC*
- Earn 2 credits in the same world language
- Earn at least 1 credit in an AP, IB, AICE or a dual enrollment course

*A student is exempt from the Biology 1 or U.S. History EOC assessment if the student is enrolled in an AP, IB or AICE Biology 1 or U.S. History course and the student earns the minimum score to earn college credit on the respective AP, IB or AICE assessment.

Merit Diploma Designation

- Meet the standard high school diploma requirements.
- Attain one or more industry certification from the list established (per s. 1003.492, F.S.).

What are the graduation requirements for students with disabilities ?

Two options are available only to students with disabilities. Both require the 24 credits listed in the table, and both allow students to substitute a career and technical education (CTE) course with related content for one credit in ELA 4, mathematics, science and social studies (excluding Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology 1 and U.S. History). The two options are as follows:

- Students with significant cognitive disabilities may earn credits via access courses and be assessed via an alternate assessment.
- Students who choose the academic and employment option must earn at least 0.5 credit via paid employment.

Where is information on financial aid located?

The Florida Department of Education's Office of Student Financial Assistance administers a variety of postsecondary educational state-funded grants and scholarships. To learn more, visit the Office of Student Financial Assistance website.

Where is information on Bright Futures Scholarships located?

The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program rewards students for their academic achievements during high school by providing funding to attend a postsecondary institution in Florida. For more information, visit the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program website.

State University System (SUS)

Admission into Florida's public universities is competitive. Prospective students should complete a rigorous curriculum in high school and apply to more than one university to increase their chance for acceptance. To qualify to enter one of Florida's public universities, a first-time-in-college student must meet the following minimum requirements (credit earned by industry certification does not count for SUS admission):

- High school graduation with a standard diploma, a minimum of a 2.5 GPA, and admission test scores meeting minimum college-ready test scores per Board of Governors Regulation (BOG) 6.008
- 16 credits of approved college preparatory academic courses per BOG Regulation 6.002
 - 4 English (3 with substantial writing)
 - 4 Mathematics (Algebra 1 level and above)
 - 3 Natural Science (2 with substantial lab)
 - 3 Social Science
 - 2 World Language (sequential, in the same language or other equivalents)
- 2 approved electives

State University System of Florida

The Florida College System

The 28 colleges of the Florida College System serve nearly 800,000 students. Colleges offer affordable, stackable, workforce credentials including certificate programs, associate in science degrees and associate in arts degrees, which transfer to a bachelor's degree program. Many colleges also offer workforce bachelor's degree programs in areas of high demand. All Florida College System institutions have open-door admissions for students who have earned a standard high school diploma, an equivalent diploma or have successfully earned college credit.

Florida also offers students 49 accredited career and technical colleges or centers throughout the state, which provide the education and certification necessary to work in a particular career or technical field. Welcome to the Indian River Schools SIS parent registration portal. The Focus Parent Portal is a tool designed to enhance communication and involvement for you in your child's education. This portal will allow you to monitor your child's progress in school by providing timely access to both assignments and grades that are entered by the teacher throughout the grading period. This communication tool will improve your ability to assist your child and to communicate with the teacher if necessary.

If you wish to create a Parent Portal Account, you have three options to choose from:

1. If you do not know your child's Student ID number, you cannot register from home and you will need to visit your child's school and bring with you a valid Driver's License or a government-issued photo ID.
2. If your child's social security number is on file with the school district and you know your child's Student ID number, you can register from home. By using a valid email address, you can create and activate your account using the attached directions.
3. If you know your child's Student ID number but your child's SSN is not on file with the district or you are not willing to provide the last four digits of your child's Social Security Number, you can create an account from home using the attached directions but will need to visit the school to activate your account.

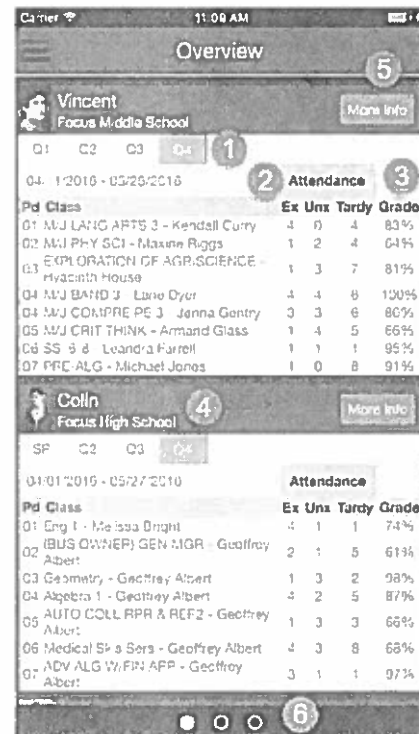

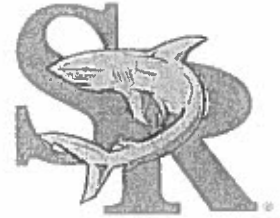
